Also, Master Philip, Baron Erwin and Lord Theron are making arrangements to transport people's tents beforehand and set them up during week one of war. We would ask Our populace to don the colors of Dun Carrig and stand with us during the Grand Procession portion of the Opening Ceremonies (Sunday morning, August 5th). We know it is hot, and dusty. BARONIAL BUSINESS MEETING

There will be no August business meeting, as the scheduled date falls during Pennsic. The September meeting will be held Tuesday, September 4th at 7:30 PM, at the Southern Maryland Higher Ed Center in California. (44219 Airport Road California, MD).

FROM CHARLES CO & THE NORTH: Take Route 5 to Route 235. Follow Route 235 approximately 13 miles to Wildewood Shopping Center (Airport Road). Turn right on Airport Road; Center is 3/10 mile up the hill on the left.

FROM CALVERT CO & THE SOUTH: From Solomons: Follow Route 4 across the Bridge into St. Mary's County. Proceed approximately 4 miles to the intersection of Rt. 4 and Rt. 235. Turn Right (North) on Route 235 At the 2nd light, turn left onto Airport Road (at the Outback Steak House) and proceed 3/10 mile. Center is on the left.

FROM PATUXENT RIVER NAVAL AIR BASE: North on Route 235 - 6 miles. Turn Left

Minutes

July 3, 2007

Old Business

Challenge Recap

Baron Erwin asked Mathias to put together a list of "lessons learned" from Challenge. Mathias's tips:

For those volunteering to autocrat:

Think about your normal routine—if it's hectic, autocratting might not be for you

Be organized.

Write down *everything.*

Make sure at least B&B and seneschal know where things are—if possible, everyone should know.

Get all site restrictions well in advance, and in writing

Build a fudge factor into the budget

Advertise a lot

Add to ambience whenever possible—the ladies gallery, artisans row & high table service were well received.

Mathias thanks everyone for all their help and hard work; the event went really well.

Jackie, the ranger, informed Mathias that they were happy with the condition of the site; she has emailed the county office asking them to send back our deposit. This could take a few weeks.

We were out of the building by 8 PM, so there were no fees for being in the building late.

Camping may or may not be workable, because the areas where they put tents is in among the cabins—fine for small modern tents, but not workable for large ones, especially period tents.

Numbers:

Total attendees- 141, 15 non-members

751.03 spent on feast

305 spent on porta-potties

As it stands right now, the overall profit was 369.77 (including paying for those who went over budget). This assumes return of deposit.

2 refunds were approved for site fees.

It was brought up by the cooks that, in the future, anyone needing kitchen access (for water, etc.) should get permission from cooks, rather than just wandering in.

Mathias thanked Mathilde and Jeff for artisan's row & the high table service—they both added a great deal to the event and were very well received.

He also thanked Isolda for running ladies gallery.

It was suggested that next year, we might want to do a serving area near the field for dayboard—to allow people who don't want to leave the field to get food.

Relay

Due to attendance and other issues, we did not have the encampment demo at Relay. However, the barony raised 1221 for the American Cancer Society. 415,000 was the Calvert County Relay total.

Kiri and Philip's ACS dinner (the one auctioned off as part of the fundraising effort for Relay) will be Monday night. Theron is serving. The dinner will be part of the food plan, so that everyone in the camp can enjoy it.

Birthday

Alisandair was unable to be present, but provided a report, as follows:

Will announce to the DC News list that I'm going to be looking to hold a planning meeting for Birthday sometime right after Pennsic

The plans are pretty similar to what we had last Birthday wherein we had thrown weapons and archery towards the back of the building and heavy and Rapier towards the front.

Matt has graciously offered his services as Head Cook but we still would like someone to handle Dayboard. Children's activities are tentatively planned around a "Day in the life of a Viking Child" and will be going on throughout the day. Unknown at this time if there will be any page-level activities

since there are difficulties in getting responses from the Dean of Pages to Kier's requests for approval of classes.

Champions need to conduct the tournaments to choose their successors. We're looking to hold at least one melee based on a "Vikings vs. Villagers" theme. Details on how to handle the sides are still pending and suggestions are welcome. (End of Alisandair's Report)

Muirghen has volunteered to mentor Alisandair, as he autocrats Birthday.

A Birthday planning meeting will be held after Pennsic—the budget planning meeting with Alisandair (autocrat), Matthew (head cook), Serena (exchequer) and Theron (seneschal).

Theron pointed out that he would really like to see jobs at events change hands, as many of the same people are doing the same things event after event.

Pennsic

The financial committee voted to approve up to 299.99 for a water heater for the barony for Pennsic. All 5 members of the financial committee were in attendance. The motion passed unanimously.

Food Plan

The food plan was run by Hank last year. He will run it again. However, he needs volunteers for cooking. Erwin volunteered to help with logistics, shopping, etc.

This year, it has been requested that people kick in ahead of time for food, as well as for wood and ice, rather than having Hank or Minna front the money.

Food will cost \$5 per person per day, with the cost for ice and wood to be determined.

**If you are going to Pennsic and intend to be on meal plan, please get money to Hank & Mindy ASAP. \$5/person per day.

New Business

Lady Serena proposed that the head cook, in addition to the autocrat, seneschal, and exchequer, needs to be at budget meetings for any event.

In years past, event budgets were done at meetings, and it has been suggested that this should be restarted. An alternate suggestion was making sure that it's announced at a meeting that anyone who plans to spend money needs to coordinate with autocrat ahead of time.

Molly pointed out that money shouldn't be spent without consulting autocrat anyway.

Theron suggested that event budgets be discussed at event planning meetings, to give basic bare bones ideas for budget.

Flyer needs to be out 3 months or so before an event.

Monday the 16th at 6:30 will be a budget meeting for Birthday

Middle Eastern Event

Lore will be autocrating Middle Eastern, Kiri is cooking. We need to start planning that in August. Flyer would need to be in Nov I.

Demos

The castellan was not present, but provided a written report:

Have contacted Ann Marie Gardens and we're on the list for an information packet when they are mailed out at the first of September. Once we're filled in I can then talk about trying to get a little larger space in which to set up our area. Would like to see the same sort of stuff as we had last year. A&S entries, photos and photo albums of events and of fighting, a display of our weapons (real and combat ready rattan) and armor. Also would like to have a better selection of candy than we had last year. The \$50 that was allocated last year left little options for dealing with the estimated 5,000 kids above and beyond Tootsie Rolls. Would like either a bit more allocated for the demo, or if the members of the populace could chip in a bag of something when they gear up for their own trick-or-treaters it would allow for a more varied haul for the kids. (End of Alsandair's report)

Molly wants to do a demo at the college—after Pennsic when kids come back for the fall semester. We also have Blessing of the Fleet coming up, and we may be able to do a demo at the Celtic festival.

Officers

Webminister

Nothing new to report. Matthew is awaiting court report to update awards on the webpage.

Chronicler

After last month, Adriana sent an email to Lord Otto, the kingdom chronicler, asking questions that had been asked by the barony. She received a reply & provided the barony with the answers:

Baronial Device: To the question of why our baronial device didn't appear in the ad for Challenge, the reply was that there are several reasons, including space considerations & having the group's device on file. In our case, what happened was that for groups that send in a flyer rather than using SPIKE, Otto creates a watermark of the device to use in the background. Although it looks good in the proof, he's found that it doesn't show up in print.

Event Registration To the question regarding the new requirements for getting an event SPIKEd as no conflict, the answer was that the change was basically a clarification. There are certain requirements from Kingdom for an event to be official, and if two groups try to SPIKE an event as no-conflict and are within 100 miles of each other, the first group to SPIKE the event with all the required

information gets the weekend. (To clarify, the kingdom chronicler gave this example: f group A submitted an ERF (Event Request Form) in January for a no-conflict event in June but is missing who the MIC or MOL will be and group B submits a completed ERF in March for the same weekend and same status and the site is within 100 miles from each other AND group A hasn't updated their original data, the weekend goes to group B.)

MOA&S

Khadir needs info from Rose & Mathilde on A&S for Challenge, so that he can complete his report.

Not the "Chirurgion"

Minna needs the water bottles back.

Exchequer

Challenge of the Heart NMS report and check of \$45 was sent to Kingdom NMS Deputy; copy of report was sent to Kingdom Exchequer.

Check for \$13.03 was given to Hank (Khadir) for general feast supplies. (Approved by Exchequer per Financial Policy).

Check for \$76.05 was given to Jim (Mathias) for the cabin repairs at Kings Landing Park. (Prior approval given by the Financial Committee).

Receipts have been turned in for Challenge of the Heart. Checks are to be given to Heather (Amalia) for tokens; Mindy (Minna) for chirurgion; Jim (Mathias) for banner dowels; and Richard (Syr Richard) for prizes. Also approved were two refunds of site fees. Event report has been finalized. Event profit was \$369.77

Breakfast fundraiser at Challenge of the Heart brought in \$59.00

Budget for Birthday needs to be done asap.

My 2nd quarter report is due by July 31st.

I'm still working with those who have funds approved for them for spending but that haven't been spent yet. Theron regarding the List Fence (\$40 approved); Theron regarding the baronial tent repair (\$20 approved); & Mathias regarding general Quartermaster supplies for loaner gear and kitchen supplies (\$75 approved).

Decided that money raised (\$59) goes into baronial account.

Herald

Mathias will get a court report out asap---has one question for Theron, will be out Wed or Thursday

He submitted his quarterly report online, and also copied B&B

Quartermaster

Theron went over the duties of the QM:

- ◆ Keep an accurate accounting of baronial, where it is, and who has it
- ◆ Be on hand when stuff goes to people

He noted that storing and transporting baronial gear is not part of the quartermaster's job.

Mathias will meet with the B&B to do a post-event inventory.

Shed: The manager at the Patuxent Naval Exchange is going back and forth with the manager at the Norfolk NEX. There are no plans to ship any sheds to ours, because it's small, despite the fact that several people have ordered them. Norfolk wants Pax or the customer to pay shipping if they send it down. We're hoping this will be resolved in the next couple weeks.

B&B

Molly and Erwin want to say that they thought everyone did an amazing job at Pennsic.

Molly asks those going to Pennsic to do more SPIKE fundraising.

Seneschal

Theron has turned in his quarterly report.

He has the event waivers, but needs waivers from MOL.

There may not be an August meeting—definitely won't be first week. Let Theron know if you have some need to have a business meeting.

After the huge success of the first wood castle, there's now a plan to build another castle. Eventually, we probably will build 4 with connecting walls.

Storvik novice is in 2 weeks,; it's a royal progress. There will be a war practice the Sunday after Storvik Novice
