

Lady Bozhana is continuing her research into Russian costuming; Lord Theron displayed his skill at making Byzantine shoes and is delving into shoes from different times & countries. Lady Helewyse is spearheading a campaign to inspire all of us to dress "more seeming and proper" and m'Lady Renee braved the masses to instruct many of us on the art of fingerloop braiding.

M'Lady Jeanette has jumped in with both feet, creating chainmaile items for display, providing many beautiful chains to enhance our calendars and volunteering to teach our January 25th A&S class. M'lady Serena has been a personal inspiration to me with her willingness and her enthusiasm. Please note that the temperature in the hall will be kept cool, so feel free to break out your wools, silks and furs in high Burgundian style.


